

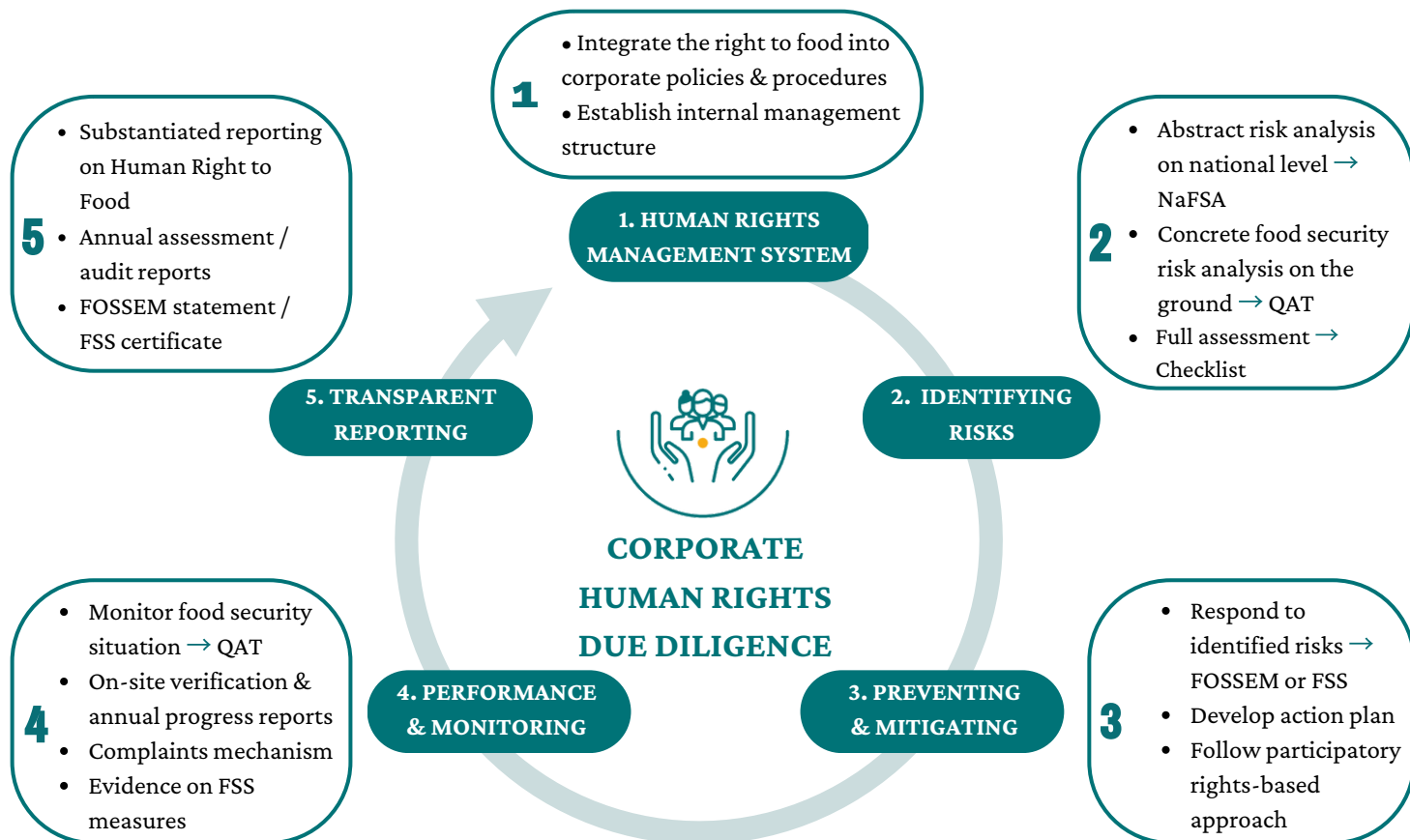


WHY DO WE NEED THE FOOD SECURITY STANDARD (FSS)?

Many agricultural goods used in Europe for food or material use are produced in countries of the Global South. Yet, more than 800 million people still go hungry globally; most of them live in the rural regions of the Global South and depend on agriculture for their livelihoods (FAO 2015). Respecting the human right to adequate food is closely linked to 11 other essential rights related to health, social security and development impacting issues like child labor or deforestation. Ultimately, zero hunger for smallholder farmers and agricultural workers is the foundation for sustainable supply chains. The German Federal Ministry of Food and Agriculture entrusted Welthungerhilfe and Meo Carbon Solutions to provide market participants a hands-on solution to address food insecurity in agricultural supply chains.

- Identifies and mitigates human rights risks related to food by implementing the FSS at the production level
- Creates positive long-term impacts on the living conditions of workers, farmers and surrounding communities



THE FSS TOOLBOX

The FSS toolbox is tailored to the specific circumstances of small businesses, medium-sized farms or plantations. The tools can be used for FSS certification or to assess potential and actual risks at production level in their operation and area of responsibility.



National Food Security Assessment (NaFSA)

- Identifies potential human rights risks by country, with a special focus on the right to food through publicly available data
- Defines a risk level for eight categories that determine the social context as well as a national risk level for initial prioritization
- Provides additional questions for the audit



FSS Quick Assessment Tool (QAT)

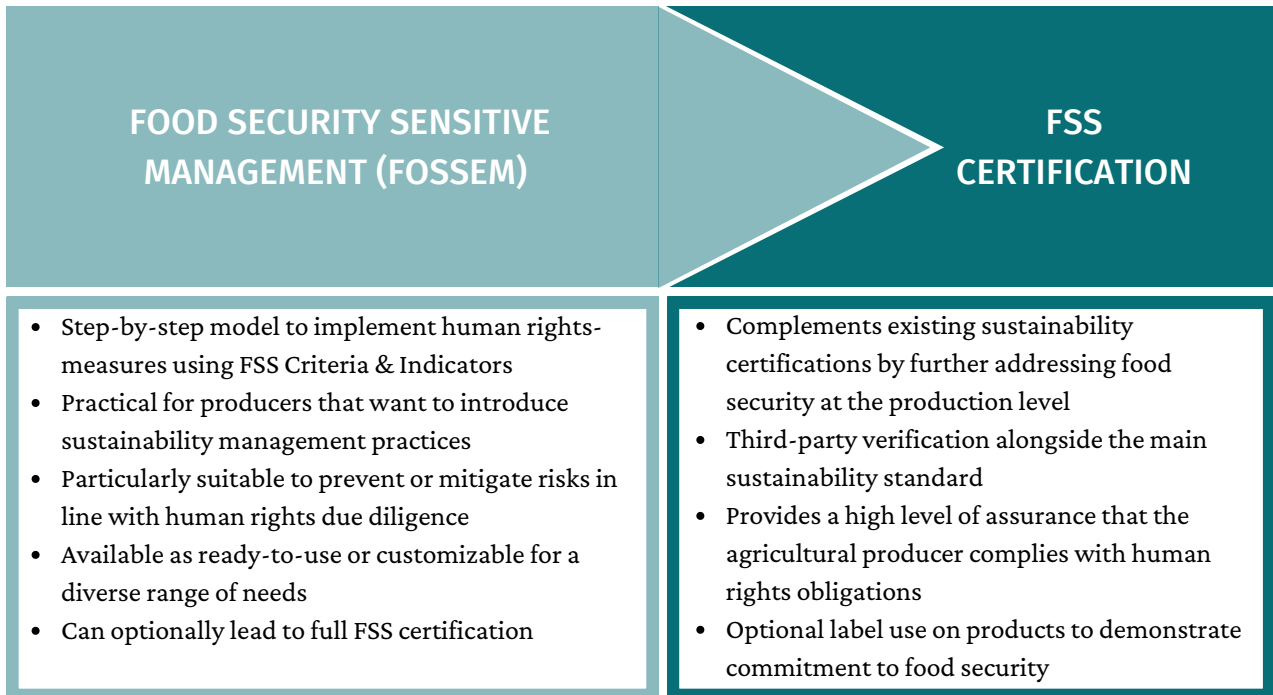
- Determines concrete food security risks at the local level
- Provides a structured interview questionnaire for smallholder farmers, workers and stakeholders
- Implements cost-effective food security monitoring



FSS Audit Procedure Tool (Checklist)

- Offers a complete audit checklist—including criteria, indicators and guidance for verification
- Serves to develop an improvement plan for monitoring and reporting
