Food security is more likely in countries with high levels of human development. The Human Development Index (HDI) shows a high human development, which is good.

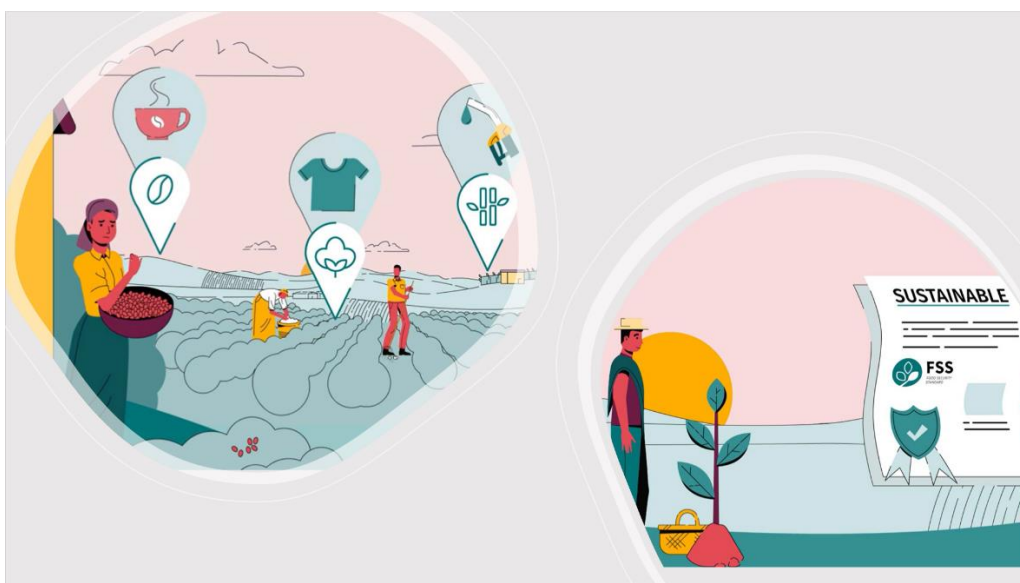

To make food security achievable and manageable, we constantly strive to improve the FSS tools. For that purpose we integrated the National Food Security Assessment (NaFSA) tool into our website and made it interactive.

The NaFSA facilitates a quick and easy, yet comprehensive overview of the national food security situation and framework conditions using publicly available information from websites of UN agencies or other relevant institutions. This tool helps you identify potential critical issues regarding the realization of the Right to Food at national level. For each of the 8 categories there are several indicators that sum up and help you evaluate the situation in each of the categories.
